

CAVE OF PLATO

We are naturally drawn to stay in our comfort zone, but God designed us to come out.

CAVE OF IGNATIUS

St. Ignatius detached from the world within a cave and wrote Rules for Discernment. He invites us to detach and honor ourselves as a temple of God. (Ignatian Rules & Modes of Discernment can be found on website under Resources: Gathering Notes July 2025 ~ The Search for God's Will)

Agere Contra ~ Act against, do against to seek detachment.

If a stick is bent one way, we must bend it further in the other direction to make it straight. If we are attached to or addicted to a worldly good, we go the opposite way (even further). It is not suffering for the sake of suffering. The goal is to detach ourselves from anything that is a barrier to the Divine.

“All the things in this world are gifts of God, created for us, to be the means by which we can come to know him better, love him more surely, and serve him more faithfully. As a result, we ought to appreciate and use these gifts of God insofar as they help us toward our goal of loving service and union with God. But insofar as any created things hinder our progress toward our goal, we ought to let them go.” St. Ignatius of Loyola

CAVE OF BETHLEHEM

Ignatian Lent Meditation Preparation

Jesus desires us to open the door, let Him in, no matter how messy our cave . . . no matter if we feel unworthy or ready . . . no matter the excuse. Jesus wants to come in and love us, hold us, rest in us, and pour His light into us. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you recall a happy childhood memory. Notice all the details of that memory. Look around. Notice the time of year, who is with you, what are you doing? Now invite Jesus into this memory. Please repeat after me, “Jesus, will you please make Yourself Present to me in this memory?”

Walk towards Him. Come as you are. Lay down your burdens. Lay down your shame. Lift up your face. You know Him. He knows you. He reaches out His hands to you. Enfold Him into your arms. Love Him. Let Him love you. Rest in His arms. Ask Him to expose any attachments you have to things of the world. Ask Him what He desires for your Lent this year. Let Him love you right there. Love Him in return. You are His. You are seen. You are known. You are loved. This is the Living Water you have thirsted for your entire life. Drink in His love.
